





Friday 11th March meet at the Maryborough Caravan Park for registration at 4.30pm followed by a 5pm start for the run to the Talbot Hotel and back approximately **40km**.

Saturday 12th March meet at the Hockey field car park 9am for registration followed by a 9.30am start for the run to Maldon for morning tea,and to Lockwood South, Lockwood, Kangaroo Flat then on to Bendigo to see Dr. Dugal James collection of motorcycles and a catered lunch (\$15 for adults/\$7.50 for children) or bring your own. Return to Maryborough via Lockwood and Eddington **145km** approximately.

Sunday 13th March meet at the Maryborough Post Office 8.30am for a 9am start for the run to Newstead, then onto Guilford for morning tea. And not to be outdone, Conor Murphy set up two tables - not hard to do for a cabinet maker. Conor is seen here wheeling and dealing.




1934 B.S.A. 600CC OHU SLOPER OUTFIT

This motorcycle was originally registered number 31-796 and was sold by its first owner who is believed to have been a doctor to Tom Maloney who had


a Motorcycle Shop at 186 Moorabool Street, Geelong. Tom onsold it to Roy Hopgood who resided on a farm in the Ballarat area. See copy of original receipt dated 7/9/1937. Roy traded in a 1925 B.S.A 250 cc round tank



which he received £42-10-0 and paid an extra £37 cash for the B.S.A outfit. The motorcycle was regularly used to travel from Ballarat to Geelong and from Ballarat to Melbourne. In November 1939

he took the motorcycle to the Geelong Motor Cycle Co. at 245 Moorabool Street, Geelong and paid £10-12-1 to have the gearbox repaired.

Shortly after
Roy enlisted in the army
and stored the motorcycle under wool sacks
in a shed on the farm.
In 1949 the motorcycle
was reregistered in his
name with a new registration number of 43914.




When his wife was pregnant with their first child he purchased an Austin 7 and sold the motorcycle to Roy Hatfield of Eureka Street, Ballarat who was a radio repair man. Hatfield removed the sidecar body and replaced it with a wooden box and was often seen around the area by Hopgood with a large old wooden cased radio in it. Hatfield re-registered the motorcycle in 1955 and it was now registration number BC 921. On Hatfield's passing the motorcycle was given to his son who pulled it to bits. Hopgood heard on the grapevine in Ballarat that the son had wrecked it and assumed he had hit a lamp post or similar.

The motorcycle in pieces was purchased by the Vella family and restored and was registered in February 1978 as LL 637 and ridden by Manny Vella, in 1982 it was again re-registered in February to Manny and given the registration number of OB 975.

In 1993, after my sons Robert and Scott had a short ride in Peter Margerison's Triumph Outfit, I decided that I needed to add an outfit motorcycle to my collection. At the time I had a 1925 350 BSA S/V which I still have. I then went to the Bendigo Swap meet and found Manny selling the BSA outfit and subsequently purchased it.

Shortly afterwards I was able to trace its history as in 1993 VicRoads had the records still on their microfiche system. Sadly, this is no longer the case. I rang Roy

Hopgood and he could not believe that it was still about as he had believed that the motorcycle had crashed. I later contacted the family to say that I would bring the motorcycle to them on the way home from a Maryborough Rally and they informed me that Roy had passed away but that they would love to see the motorcycle again. We visited their farm and they had relatives from all over Victoria attend and put on a great afternoon tea for us. I took Roy's widow for a ride in the sidecar and she said it bought back great memories to her.









CHILTERN RALLY 2021 By Phil Long



BOOK REVIEW

Reviewed by Jonathan Hill "Granville Bradshaw: a flawed genius?" 2nd Edition

Granville Bradshaw

was an engineer and inventor of extraordinary vision. His now legendary and often revolutionary designs for early aeroplanes and

aero engines such as the Drag onfly, pioneering cars and motorcycles, including the ABC, and his interesting oil-cooled engines, quickly brought him fame and success. His designs for gambling machines made him a fortune which he then managed to lose as a victim of a shares swindle! His life spanned the entire development of the aviation and motor industries from the very early days right up until the classic era of the 1950s.

Lancashire-born in 1886, Bradshaw was apprenticed to a large engineering company where he progressed through the various departments to the drawing office where he trained as a draughtsman. His elder brother Ewart had a profitable sideline buying and selling bicycles and motorcycles, fostering in Granville an interest in powered vehicles which he learnt to repair. He began riding motorcycles in 1900 at the age of 14 – as you were allowed to in those days. Disillusioned by heavy engineering and interested in the new-fangled aeroplanes, he joined the Star Engineering Company, helping to design the Star Monoplane and learned to fly at Brooklands in 1909.

His innovative flair for design produced some outstanding results with radial aero engines during WW1, for which he was awarded the OBE. Whilst at Sopwith's in 1918, Bradshaw designed and built the then very advanced ABC flat-twin motorcycle with its four-speed unit construction o.h.v. engine, hub brakes and rear suspension - allegedly (but very unlikely), built in 11 days. In 1923 he designed the new o.h.v. "Panther" engine for Phelon and Moore (P. & M.), followed later by the radic, but flawed, Panthette 250c.c. o.h.v. transverse V-twin and in 1939 the 500c.c. vertical in-line twin Panther machine.

A man of supreme self-confidence and no doubt charm – he was twice married and divorced, with five children. Even today, opinions are divided about him. To quote TCM's Richard Rosenthal: "Charlatan or visionary genius? The case could be made for both, with reference to Granville Bradshaw."

This is a really detailed, carefully researched and absorbing book that places Bradshaw's engineering genius into the context of his time. Following further research this second edition adds to the first and includes a new 10-page chapter on Walter Lawson Adams – a pioneering multi-talented aircraft and mechanical engineer with whom Bradshaw sometimes collaborated. Some 40 new photos and illustrations have also been included.

Based in Bundalong near Yarrawonga their factory, in the past six months, has turned out some of the following jobs.



Factory finish! A frame that came in for Mason to straighten had a severely dented rear fork tube. The tube was removed and replaced with equal thickness tubing brazed in along with the welding up a few holes in the castings.

As soon as one goes out the door, the next one another stroker motor is nearly ready to go out on the streets with their stainless steel intake. Just waiting on some cam lobes and it'll be ready to be picked up by the customer.



Mason is relieving heads for the stroker motors and relieving cases for the larger stroke and larger cams. Also they supply new Indian big base Sport Scout barrels and components and porting to suit.

A quick little job straightening an original paint 20's scout frame ready for the customer to take back and complete the frame while they get ready to rebuild the motor to go in it. Note the laser alignment.
