# **BARRY HOLLAND AND ROSS STEWART**


Barry Holland, who was involved in a tragic accident at Goorambat (North West of Benalla) on Tuesday 14th December, sadly passed away on Saturday 8th January. Barry had been flown to Melbourne by air ambulance and remained in hospital with extremely serious injuries.

Barry and his good friend Ross Stewart were riding their Moto Guzzi's when allegedly a utility veered into them at a curve on crossroads. Tragically Ross was killed in the accident. Ross who was 81 had recently purchased his new motorcycle.



Barry who resided in Wangaratta attended many Chiltern Rallies and regularly displayed his Levis at our Club stand at Historic Winton. Barry was enamoured with Levis motorcycles and his restorations were first class.

He was working on another restoration and had advertised in the October Exhaust notes for parts for a 1932 Burman Gear Box. Barry enjoyed rides during the week on the back roads, often riding in company with fellow member David James and Ross Stewart who had moved into a new house in Wangaratta after leaving the Cobram area. Ross met many of our members when he had ridden out to Eldorado with David James to visit us on the recent Chiltern Rally.

# The police report on the accident, stated:

"Detectives from the Major Collision Investigation Unit have charged a man after a fatal collision in Goorambat on Tuesday 14th December. Emergency services were called to Goorambat-Thoona Road at the intersection with Bungeet and Hammond roads about 12.10pm after reports a utility had collided with two motorcycles. Sadly, an 80-year-old male rider from Wangaratta died at the scene. The second rider, a 70-year-old Wangaratta man, was airlifted to hospital with life-threatening injuries. The driver of the white Toyota utility, a 35-year-old Tatong man, was not injured and stopped at the scene. He has been charged with one count each of dangerous driving causing death and dangerous driving causing serious injury. He appeared at the Wangaratta Magistrates' Court where he was granted bail to reappear at the same court on the 7th April 2022."

# **VALE STAN HURLSTON**


Sadly, Stan Hurlston passed away on Friday 17th December. Stan who was 89 was a much valued and popular member of the VMCC of Vic.





# **BOOK REVIEW**

Reviewed by Jonathan Hill "The BSA Bantam Bible" All models 1948-1971

This book is dedicated to the late Alastair Cave and to the women and men of BSA, who built the Bantam.

The BSA Bantam is a phenomenon. In numerical terms, it is

the most successful British bike ever built, with 100,000 built in the first four years of production – and over thirty years after the last one left the production line, thousands are still on the road.

However, the Bantam might never have happened without World War II. The BSA (and Harley-Davidson) directors were anticipating a large post-war demand for a simple low-cost two-stroke commuter machine for a financially strapped population. Frustratingly, at this time, they had no experience of making two-stroke machines of this type. The problem was solved when the well designed and developed pre-war German DKW RT125 was offered to the Allies as reparations, taken up and produced in the USA and USSR. In Britain it surfaced publicly in 1948 as the much-modified BSA Bantam, a very simple little 123cc two-stroke, with rudimentary electrics, telescopic front forks but no rear suspension – and a lot of charm.

The little bike became part of Britain's social history. Thousands of people learnt to ride on a Bantam, or had their first pillion experience on one or road one delivering telegrams for what was the GPO.

Whilst looked back on with great affection by many previous owners, they no doubt also remembered the intermittent electrics, the feeble brakes and the limitations of the three-speed gearbox. Yet it was also a tough little bird as well. Not only did Bantams carry a generation to and from work every day, but they proved capable of feats the original designers at DKW could never have envisaged. Bantams have crossed continents and climbed mountains. They have raced at the TT, around race circuits, been successful in scrambles and trials and even ridden the "Wall of Death."

Chapters include the year-by-year, change-by-change evolution details – A complete history of the Bantam – How it came about – post-war reparations from Germany – Bantam cousins – Harley and Russian "Bantams" – Success! – the early years – Growing up – the 148cc and 175cc Bantams – Tragedy – lack of development leads to declining sales – What might have been – could the Bantam have survived? – Useful contacts – Facts and Figures – What to look for when buying a second-hand Bantam.

Author Peter Henshaw has written an excellent book with contributions from former Bantam development engineer Michael Martin and information from Mike Jackson and Peter Glover.



# NAME PLATE FOR A 1938 AJS



Photo of the name plate that Mick Guilfoyle has just finished for Andrew Jeffery. The job was for Andrew's super rare and super nice 1939 AJS Silver Streak and is painted in 2K and finished with super hard epoxy clear coat. Mick's mate Paul Clark hand painted the cursive lettering in the style that was used in the 1939 AJS sales catalogue and Mick took care of the welding, painting and cut and polishing duties.

Mick's photo 'artistically' shows the name plate placed on the write up on Andrew's AJS on pages 66 to 70 in Issue No. 94 of 'Old Bike Australasia' which was in the newsagents in June 2021.

# Numbers of machines in collections...

A query posted on the United Kingdom's Vintage Motor Cycle Club (VMCC) Group on Facebook.

**David Cooper** wondered what the average size of collections are for older machines?

For example, how many 1930's machines exist (either rideable or close to being so) and how many owners have them? I suspect (with some small evidence based on personal observation) that a large proportion of the oldest bikes are parts of collections. Which is one reason why they are perhaps less visible. If I have three Nortons, that's two people who cannot own one, and two fewer potential VMCC owners of prewar machines. Not saying there's a 'solution', or even that there's a 'problem'.

#### **Paul Turner**

Yes, many old bikes owned by people who never use them or just keep them for an investment and because of this no spares are ever needed, so it becomes unviable to manufacture them.

# **Tony Baxter**

I have several old bikes but don't have them as investments and happy to lend them to friends if they want to try something older.

#### Paul O'leary

Tony Baxter - Hello my new bestest friend.

#### Roger Clarke

Not many 1930's bike around, I joined the vintage club in 1963 and then the bikes had to be pre 1930 so anything 1931 to the war years were too new for the club then after the war they were getting too old for every day use so were scrapped leaving a shortage of bikes left from the 30's, I still ride a 1935 Velocette GTP and have recently sold a 1937 Velocette MAC. I have 1 1919 bike, 5 1929 bikes, 1 1947 bike, 5 1950's, 3 1960's, 1 1977, and 1 2013.

#### Jim Walker

I have 1930, 1946, 1958 and 1976. Plus some more modern stuff. All get ridden. But not at once, that would be a tad extravagant.

#### David Cooper Author

The VMCC 'Register of Machines' (1991) lists about 110 1920's OHV Nortons, and only about 90 from the 1930's. If we look at all types up to 1927 (flat tankers), the total comes to about 160. Where are they all? The Register is nowhere near complete.

Judging by the numbers in the 1991 Register, the numbers in museums must be a tiny fraction of the total, and the museums do raise our profile. Lots of museum machines (cars and bikes) are actually privately owned by someone who's happy for them to be seen and reasonably safely stored. And my little group of four took 25 years to gather together, so annual average price is not very high.


