
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



BOOK REVIEW by Jonathan Hill

"Franklin's Indians"

Irish motorcycle racer Charles B. Franklin, designer of the Indian Scout and Chief Authors: Harry V. Sucher, Tim Pickering, Liam Diamond, Harry Havelin.

Charles Franklin, the first Irish motorcycle racing superstar,

was born in Dublin in 1880 where he quickly became involved in motorcycle racing during the pioneer years. He rapidly established himself as both a rider and tuner, particularly of Indian machines. One of the instigators of the Isle of Man TT races, he consistently finished in the top eight and in 1911, riding an Indian, claimed second place, a remarkable achievement in itself. But it was when he moved in 1916 to the Indian concern in Springfield, USA, where he later became the Chief Design Engineer, that his genius really became apparent. His design catapulted Indian back into the forefront of motorcycle design in the 1920s and '30s and his racing engines and motorcycles won much glory for Indian.

The Indian Scout and Chief are two of the best known and best loved of all classic American motorcycles. The man who designed them, Charles Franklin, was responsible for many advanced design concepts including remarkable improvements in side-valve combustion chamber design that pre-dated the work of Ricardo. His 600cc Scout of 1920 was an all-new integrated design. Ground breaking features included its double-loop full cradle frame, unitized semi-unit construction engine with enclosed valves, and geared primary drive. On a "works" Indian Freddy Dixon took second place in the 1923 Senior TT in the Isle of Man.

Intending to stay in America for only six months, Franklin never returned to Ireland, being joined by his wife and daughter in 1920. Tragically, this refined, enigmatic man died of cancer in 1932 at the age of 52. Charles Franklin was in the thick of all the engineering activity at Indian. He was still the man in charge of design engineering. The design work he performed or co-ordinated during the 1930-32 period laid the foundation for the new, modern Indians that would see the company out to the end of its day in 1953. This excellent book not only chronicles Franklin's fascinating family history and life and times in Ireland, but also contains detailed descriptions of early TT races. Much new light is also shed on the history of Indian motorcycles and the often turbulent times of the Indian Motorcycle Company itself. An absolutely essential book for Indian enthusiasts and motorcycle historians alike. This is, in my opinion, one of the best motorcycle history books in recent years.



VALE: WESLEY (WES) VICKERS

Wes was born on 3rd January 1932 in Blackburn. When he was aged 2 the family moved to Sandy Bay in Tasmania. At the out break of war in 1939, the family moved back to Victoria to McPhail Street Essendon, where Wes attended Essendon State School, Essendo-High School and later Essendon Technical School. At age 18 Wes joined Riverside Miniature Car Club. Members built model cars which they raced at a club circuit. Showing an early aptitude of engineering, Wes's car, the 'Mills Bomb', was featured in a model car magazine in the 1950's.

Wes started working at the University of Melbourne as an apprentice fitter and turner and while he was working at the university he bought his first motorcycle, a 'James'. This was later traded for an 'AJS' motorcycle. After finishing his apprenticeship and further studies in toolmaking, Wes went to work as a draftsman at the Austin Motor Company in South Melbourne until they closed in the early 1950's. Then he went to Ford in Broadmeadows.

Heather and Wes met in Essendon in the late 1950's where they would go to dances in the local area. They married and bought a home in Bulla Road, North Essendon. Wes developed an interest in photography through his father Bert and by setting up his own darkroom in his mother's laundry. It was also at this time that he joined the Leica Camera Club and then later the Essendon Camera Club. In 1962 Wes entered the Yashica-Pix-Qantas 'Holiday to Japan' photo competition. His winning colour slide of a mouse being trapped gained for him and Heather a two-week trip for two to Japan, spending money and a Yashica camera.

Later in 1962, Wes's job was transferred from Ford Broadmeadows to Ford Homebush, Sydney. So the family moved to Eastwood.


In 1969, Wes had another go at a photographic competition. This time it was for Modern Motor magazine and the prize was the latest model Mercedes Benz. Again a nice simple looking picture actually took Wes months of experimentation and planning. Wes bought a large print pre-war Speed Graphic press camera and remodeled it. He made a replica of a Mercedes 3-pointed star so that his three kids could practice blowing bubbles through it. Then one Saturday morning Wes went wandering through the supermarket inspecting every brand of liquid soap in the shop to find the one just thick enough to make suitable bubbles. Wes then bought six brands of liquid soap and then tried out the soaps on his replica star. After settling on one brand of soap Wes took his three small children down to the local Mercedes Benz dealer to blow bubbles through a three point star on a Mercedes. The photo he took went on to win the magazine's competition.

Wes owned the Mercedes Benz for six weeks. It was sold and the money was used to pay off the house, extend the house, buy a boat, build a double garage and a new sewing machine for Heather. In 1970 with financial security behind him, Wes decided to leave the Ford Motor company and he took up a job with Norton Bear Tape. Wes's job with Bear Tape didn't work out. He missed the motor industry and in 1971 he got a job with Leyland as a Senior Technical Officer. However, when the P76 sent Leyland broke, Wes was out of work. He was quickly offered a job as a Maintenance Control Analyst back in

Ford Broadmeadows, so the family moved back to Melbourne and bought the family home in Grandview Grove, Rosanna.

Once back in Melbourne, Wes found that boating didn't really have the same appeal, so he sold the boat and bought a campervan – the type that sits on the back of a one-tonne Holden Ute. Heather and Wes had the Holden campervan for over forty years.

Heather and Wes, as regular church-goers in Sydney, joined Rosanna Uniting Church in Bellevue Avenue (Where our Club met for many years). Wes loved church music. He also was a member of the Bellevue Avenue choir for many years. Wes also joined Rosanna Camera Club, where he was Club President between 1979 - 80 and was a regular contributor to club photographic competitions. He really enjoyed taking photos, taking movies and videos and recording audio.



In 1983, aged 51 Wes joined the Vintage Motorcycle Club of Victoria and bought a 1930 Douglas. He later bought a 1939 Triumph and a 1915 Triumph with a wicker sidecar, which was used to transport Lynette and Alison to their weddings. This bike was on display in the church hall after his funeral service.

Wes loved vintage motorcycles and cars. He loved solving the endless problems that came with keeping old motorbikes and their engines going. Generous to the core he would also help others in solving their bike problems too. Wes and Heather both went on to became life members of the Vintage Motorcycle Club of Victoria with Wes being on the committee for over thirty years.

Retirement for Wes and Heather was a mix of granddaughters – Maddy, Isabelle and Eloise, overseas and domestic travel and bike events including rallies, displays and swap meets. In fact they'd found the perfect retirement combination – Heather got to travel and Wes got to play with his bikes.


VALE: TERRY RYAN

John Fletcher, Alan Greenway and I approached the Avoca Scouting Group about conducting a BBQ lunch for our Rally as they had done 50 years ago. Not only did they readily agree, but assistant scout master Joanne worked for Pyrenees Advocate and would promote our event through the paper. After that meeting we journeyed to Remy Martin Distillery which the Rally had visited in 1969. John, Alan and I departed Maryborough in a state euphoria On a later visit, Mick Guilfoyle, John Fletcher and I visited the now renamed Vineyard, The Blue Pyrenees to seek permission to visit. Not only were they pleased that we would be visiting, the Manager, Tess very graciously asked how they could be of assistance to the Rally, I mentioned that we would be presenting wine to our honored guests and presenters, and was immediately offered a 50% discount on any wines purchased.

By this time the trophies were in hand, the tee-shirts were organised and I approached Daryl Meek of the RACV who generously offered us fridge magnets and the other goodies that were in our rally packs. 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


